While this can facilitate faster decision-making, it may also weaken minority shareholder protection and reduce overall investment attractiveness. The analysis shows that companies with more balanced ownership structures tend to demonstrate stronger alignment between governance practices and sustainable development objectives.

From the perspective of sustainable development, effective corporate governance contributes to the integration of long-term economic goals with social and environmental considerations. Companies with stronger governance frameworks are more likely to adopt long-term development strategies rather than focusing solely on short-term financial results. This strategic orientation enhances corporate resilience and supports sustainable growth under changing economic conditions.

Overall, the results confirm that corporate governance acts as a significant driver of both investment attractiveness and sustainable development in joint-stock companies in Uzbekistan. However, institutional gaps, uneven implementation of



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governance standards, and limited enforcement mechanisms continue to constrain the full realization of governance benefits.

Ownership concentration remains a complex governance issue. While dominant shareholders may enhance operational control, excessive concentration can



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weaken minority shareholder protection and reduce overall investment appeal. The discussion suggests that balancing ownership interests through stronger legal safeguards and governance mechanisms could improve both investor confidence and sustainable corporate performance.

From a sustainable development perspective, the results demonstrate that corporate governance extends beyond financial performance.
